

## Honors College Peer Leader Application, Fall 2014

Position Description and Responsibilities: Peer Leaders will co-lead a section of HNRS 1000: Honors Foundations (1 credit hour) during fall semester 2014. Peer Leaders will be required to take HNRS 3110: Peer Leader Workshop (3 credit hours) during fall 2014 (TTh 4:30-6:00 pm) and to attend one hour of selected Honors programming each week with their Honors 1000 mentees. In HNRS 3110, peer leaders will have the opportunity to work with Honors College staff to create lesson plans that meet the course goals listed below. Additionally, Peer Mentors must also serve as Welcome Leaders for Honors Welcome and attend the necessary trainings in August.

Course Goals for HNRS 1000: Honors 1000 is designed to help first-year Honors College students adjust to the Honors College and LSU. The course helps new students understand the expectations (service, study abroad, research, senior thesis) and resources (advising, career exploration, scholarships, etc.) of the Honors College. The course is also designed to expose new students to “Honors Life” programming, such as Honors Convocation, the faculty research series, career panels, etc. Honors 1000 is also designed to help new students meet their peers and to begin thinking about how their curricular and co-curricular experiences at LSU will shape their lives after LSU.
